However, my experience with school isn't the norm or even the requirement. For example, less than five miles away from my university is Chemeketa Community College which doesn't get to have a protected learning environment because they have an incinerator half a mile from their campus. Chemeketa is a prime example of how Oregon's current land use system doesn't require cities and counties to consider the public health and environmental justice impacts the location of industrial development has now and in the future. This lack of policy leads to negative effects on air, water, and land, which leads to higher rates of asthma, cancer, reproductive harm, and more. Nevertheless, **HB 3062** will help to bridge this policy gap by requiring local governments to assess the negative health and environmental justice impacts before approving industrial development near these sensitive areas.

To help right the wrong of Chemeketa Community College by making sure this situation never happens again and by supporting this bill every child, adolescent, young adult, and family will benefit from having a safe, clean, and healthy environment around them.
