Each year the sale hits new records, most recently over \$700,000 was given back to the youth exhibitors in 2024. The EOLS grounds have seen many improvements over the years but there is always something needed to be updated or repaired. In the future, the grandstands that provide seating for the rodeo spectators will need to be replaced and/or updated. This will take money the EOLS organization doesn't have on hand. And the only way the EOLS is able to produce such an outstanding youth livestock auction is because they produce a PRCA Xtreme bull riding and a 3-day PRCA rodeo. The proceeds from tickets sales pay the way for the yearly bills and improvements made. Without updates to the grandstands and rodeo facilities, this would not be possible. The committees for these rodeos spend a lot of time making fixes with personal supplies and equipment to ensure things are done on a budget. If there were money available for the organizations to apply for, it would help them make better plans for the future. If this can happen, the next generations to come be given an opportunity to grow the experience the EOLS can give to spectators. This could increase the number of people that attend the yearly, weeklong event and in-turn will provide more for the youth of our community.
