In a 2017 study done by Baylor University² “Assessing the Faith-Based Response to Homelessness in America: Findings from Eleven Cities”, Byron Johnson examines the comparative impact of government vs faith-based programs on nearly 20,000 individuals in 11 major US cities, including Portland. **Their findings uncover the extreme benefits to private, faith-based programs over state funded agencies which then boasted a \$9.42 taxpayer savings per every \$1 of government funding.** These findings, along with long abandoned “Ten-Year Plans to End Homelessness” produced by every county in Oregon circa 2010-2012, which proved only to increase homelessness and employ the same talking points in these bills regarding government funds and oversight towards low-income housing as seen today, serve to demonstrate why government needs to stay out of “solving” homelessness entirely. In my 15 years of experience the state of Oregon overpromises only to get the opposite result, more homelessness, at a staggering cost to their citizens.

Jesus could have easily said, “You can sum up what I’m trying to tell you by simply giving away free things to poor people.” That’s not what He said, and He certainly didn’t suggest stealing from our neighbors. He told us to tell, teach, and disciple people about Himself and His teachings. That is the starting point for everything we do. You don’t have to be a Christian to benefit from us, but your life, neighborhood, county and state will be better because we are here.
