For the record, Sunday, January 26, was the 325th anniversary of the last Great M9.0 earthquake to strike Oregon in 1700. There are hundreds of millions of gallons of petroleum stored at the CEI Hub developed over decades with almost no seismic design standards in possibly the most dangerous location in Oregon, barring in the tsunami zone itself.

The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality's (DEQ) Fuel Tank Seismic Stability Program has a very full plate of work and will benefit from more financial support for their Seismic Risk Mitigation Fund. HB 2151 helps clarify and specify appropriate uses for these supplemental funds that can be used by DEQ to improve facility and community safety in the event of a fire, earthquake, or hazardous materials release.

As a former Chair of the Oregon Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission and a local emergency manager, I support HB 2151 and urge you to pass this bill.
