My name is Don Stover Jr, 32 yr Union Carpenter Local 541 and I am writing in strong SUPPORT of SB 426. As a construction worker in Oregon, I have witnessed how wage theft and labor exploitation drags down wages, hurts our communities and makes the construction industry so unattractive that it's turning away young people from careers in the trades. I am a benefactor of the trades as I was accepted into the state wide recognized apprenticeship program of the Pacific NW Carpenters Institute 2 years after I graduated from McKay H/S in Salem, Oregon.

Numerous national studies have shown that the construction industry, particularly in the residential sector, is a hotspot for abuse and exploitation. Under-the-table fraud and misclassification in construction is costing the state over \$112 million each year—money that could go toward supporting essential public services like schools, roads, and public safety.

If the State of Oregon is serious about protecting workers and putting an end to wage theft, we need to support SB 426, which will hold all market participants accountable for wage theft up and down the contracting chain.

We can't keep relying on the government to fix this problem alone. The industry itself must take responsibility and support contractors who treat their workers fairly. Reducing access to justice is not the way to combat wage theft, paying wages is.
