Testimony of Peter Bergel on HB 2038

Chair Lively and Members of the Committee:

My name is Peter Bergel. I live in Salem, and I am a constituent of Rep. Andersen's. In 1980 I was co-author and Campaign Director of Ballot Measure 7.

I am distressed that this committee is even considering a bill that calls for an investigation of nuclear power in a way that is so obviously biased. The first thing it wants ODOE to study are nuclear power's advantages. Way down the list we find "Safety of nuclear energy and nuclear waste disposal." Even further down we find reliability.

Others will discuss whether such a study represents good policy, but my questions are:

- How about nuclear power's extravagant use of water?
- How about nuclear power's release of radiation at every step of its cycle?

- How about checking into the many lies this industry has told us for 70 years?
- How about the long history of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) willingness to give the nuclear industry every possible benefit of the doubt?
- How about the recent emasculation of the NRC by the Trump administration, depriving us of even the protection that NRC did provide?
