As a member of the Chronic Absentee Task Force, I want to introduce myself; I am Dave Kline, Superintendent of the Colton School District, and here to support House Bill 3199.

I want to start off by thanking Rep. Hoa Nguyen, Sen. Suzanne Weber, and all members of our team for their dedication to support students.

Attendance is crucial for student success. A student is chronically absent if they miss 10% or more of the school year (about 18 days).

HB 3199 aims to improve Oregon's attendance efforts by addressing several key areas:

1. **Evaluating Current Initiatives**: Reviewing existing attendance programs and their effectiveness.

2. **Establishing an Advisory Committee**: Making recommendations to improve school attendance.

3. **Expanding Early Indicator Systems**: Increasing funding and refining parental notification features.

4. **Increasing Data Transparency**: Reporting attendance data quarterly to inform statewide efforts.

5. **Streamlining Attendance Reporting**: Developing consistent procedures for coding and reporting absences.

We believe this bill will enhance current attendance efforts and improve learning conditions in schools.
