Presented below is a Letter of Testimony in Support of Senate Bill 777:

Chair Golden, Vice Chair Nash and Committee.

Wolves, livestock, and ranchers have been, and will probably be into the next several generations, at war with one another. All trying to make a living for themselves within this world in the only way they know how. Wolves, preying on and killing animals as they see fit (for food or for fun); Livestock taking care of their of young, fueling their bodies for the earth and human kind to benefit from before and after death; and Ranchers choosing to put others (livestock, animals, family, community, industry, human kind) needs above their own and defend their way of life for the benefit others without those even knowing it.
