To the Honorable Members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary,

By allowing justice of the peace districts to include the county seat, this bill ensures that everyone subject to the justice court's jurisdiction can participate in the democratic process of electing the Justice of the Peace. Moreover, it provides an opportunity for residents of the county seat to serve on juries, ensuring that trials are conducted by a jury of peers who are more representative of the community. This change would enhance accountability within the justice system by making it more responsive to the needs and values of the entire community, not just parts of it. It would foster better community relations with justice institutions by ensuring that everyone has a voice in how justice is administered locally. Furthermore, it would improve access to justice by making the system more inclusive and representative.

In conclusion, SB 913 is a necessary step towards creating a more equitable and inclusive justice system in Oregon. It aligns with the principles of good governance by ensuring that all individuals subject to the justice court's jurisdiction have a say in its operations.
