Subject: CREA Testimony in support of HB-2410

To: House Committee On Climate, Energy, and Environment

Honorable Chair Lively, Vice-Chair Gamba, Vice-Chair Bobby Levy, and members of the committee.

On behalf of CREA, an intergovernmental entity representing local governments and developers of renewable energy facilities in Oregon since 2007, I am writing in **support** of **HB-2410**, relating to a small modular reactor energy facility demonstration project in Umatilla County.

Although the subject matter of nuclear energy is new at CREA, our members and communities around Oregon have been wanting to gain a better understand of the current technology, and it's potential for helping the state meet its goals for domestic clean energy generation. HB-2410 also supports micro-grid concepts, which has been a priority for CREA for many years in the support of grid resilience.

We very much appreciated the testimony from the Breakthrough Institute, and especially the Oregon Department of Energy's presentation by Assistant Director Max Woods during the informational hearing on February 27th, and we look forward to staying engaged on this topic as we continue to support new opportunities for Oregon grown energy.

We feel that this is a critical step toward the modernization and diversification of Oregon's energy portfolio, by enabling the deployment of advanced nuclear technologies. This creates a framework, exempting Umatilla County from the statewide moratorium on nuclear energy, deferring to the people of Umatilla County for their approval or rejection, allowing for beneficial energy solutions that could significantly contribute to the decarbonization efforts in the state of Oregon and our region.
