I am an Oregon resident writing to ask you to support HB 3362. This is personal for me: several years ago, an elk collided with my husband's car. Fortunately, my husband wasn't hurt, though the car sustained major damage.

Each year in Oregon, there are over 7,000 wildlife-vehicle collisions with large animals. On average, four people die and over 500 people are seriously injured. The cost of these collisions on Oregon roadways is likely more than \$100 million each year.

There is a solution. Wildlife crossing structures are a proven, popular, and costeffective technique to improve public safety and restore habitat connectivity.

Oregon needs a permanent source of funding to implement state programs and projects to improve motorist and wildlife safety. Permanent funding would:

Improve the safety of Oregon's roadways Remove barriers to wildlife Make Oregon more competitive in capturing federal funding

Please protect both our wildlife and our communities by supporting HB 3362.
