I have to balance my own needs in school, work, and life with the needs of my students, and it feels like no one is getting the best version of myself. I also know other aspiring educators who have been discouraged from teaching entirely because of the financial burden of the student teaching commitment.

Paying student teachers would allow us to put more into our practicum experiences. This would benefit us by relieving the stress of splitting our attention between so many different commitments. It would also benefit our students, mentor teachers, and other colleagues within our schools by allowing us to be more fully involved in our teaching placements, increasing continuity and minimizing stress-induced missteps. A more supportive student teaching experience would increase aspiring educators' confidence and satisfaction as we enter our teaching careers.

I urge you to support SB717 to support Oregon's aspiring educators, mentor teachers, students, and the future of Oregon's education system.
