## RE: New State Forester

I'm writing to urge all the members of the board to focus on hiring a new state forester who is committed to the following:

- Responds to the threats of climate change and implements the Climate Change and Carbon Plan.
- Fulfills the Department of Forestry's goal of being a <u>national leader in climate-smart</u> forestry.
- Protect communities from wildfires.
- Implement the Private Forest Accord.
- Adopt a new Western Oregon State Forest Management Plan.
- Finalize the Habitat Conservation Plans for private forests and western Oregon state forests.
- Restructure the ODF's revenue model.
- Restore the public's trust in the agency to operate with transparency, accountability and respect for all people.

Clear-cutting trees carries with it negative environmental and ecological impacts:

- 1. **Loss of Biodiversity**: Clear-cutting destroys habitats for many species of plants and animals, leading to a decline in biodiversity. Species that rely on specific trees or forest structures may face extinction.
