Oregon establishes a water resources research institute in 1961

Authorized by the Oregon State Board of Higher Education

Water Resources Research Act Passed in 1964

Oregon is one of 54 Water Resources Research Institutes (WRRI)

Section 104(b) Base Funding of Water Resources Research Act

~\$149,000 per year per WRRI with 1:1 State, Private, or other non-Federal Cost Share

Section 104(g) Competitive Grants Program of Water Resources Research Act

~\$300,000 for two years per grant with 1:1 State, Private, or other non-Federal Cost Share
