HB 3362 Imposes an excise tax on retail sales of tires

I personally know a lot of families that this will cause further financial stress too. Our cost of living is high here in Oregon to begin with, this will just add to it. I recently bought a set of 4 tires for my son's hybrid Civic. There was no way he could afford it. I bought him a lower quality (but not the lowest quality offered) set of all season tires. It cost me \$680 for a set of 4 tires. It was badly needed and as a 20 year old he could not afford it. The excise tax would have added another \$27.20 to the price. That is a tank of gas for his hybrid.
