Dear Chair Golden, Vice- Chair Nash and Members of the Committee:

My name is Tonya Sanchez, Executive Director of Provender Alliance. I am writing in support of SB 887 to create an Organic Policy Specialist position at the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA).

In 2022, the legislature declared organic one of five "emerging sectors" in Oregon and appropriated funds for economic assessments of each sector. The assessment laid out several opportunities to build economic, agricultural, environmental, and community resilience through the organic sector. Oregon must continue to prioritize support for organic agriculture and there is a growing need for a policy specialist who understands the principles and practices of organic farming, production and market creation.

This position would lead the facilitation, marketing, and trade of organic products, and ensure inner- & inter-agency integration of policies supporting organic practices.

Provender Alliance is a 501c-6 non-profit trade organization that has been supporting, and championing, the organic and natural food and products industry for almost 50 years. Prior to my role leading Provender, I spent 20 years helping to market and amplify the voice and products of organic farmers, while working with Organically Grown Company.
