As a trucking executive domiciled in the State of OR, we deal with rising tire costs, fuel costs, road taxes, puc taxes, UCR Registration fees, Licensing fees, rising insurance costs, rising maintenance costs (dramatically rising with all the clean air requirements for emissions).
