My name is Erin Trimble from Redmond, OR and I am writing to urge you to support <u>Senate Bill 1098</u>, which will prohibit discrimination based on the race, religion, ability, country of origin, sexuality, or gender of the individuals featured in the content of educational and library materials in K-12 public schools in Oregon.

In Oregon, we have seen countless efforts to ban books that feature LGBTQIA2S+,Black people, Indigenous people and other people of color. topics or individuals and restrict access for students to understand the positive contributions of individuals of marginalized identities who have contributed to our society. This bill creates a statewide standard ensuring freedom of information both to users of that information, as well as providers of that information, for example librarians and educators. It also ensures students have access to accurate and representative information about their histories, communities and selves.

As a parent of children in a Dual Language program, I know it is critical that these students see themselves and their classmates reflected in the books they read, and to know that their experiences are shared. I support this bill so that my children can have access to all histories and cultures, and so that I as a parent am not limited by political whims.

<u>Senate Bill 1098</u> protects student's right to see themselves represented in the books, materials and classrooms they learn from and to learn about diverse communities and people.
