Counties already have public health and safety regulations in place to ensure that events do not pose a risk to neighbors or the environment. By granting farmers the ability to host events under reasonable guidelines, we empower rural communities to sustain themselves economically without relying on external subsidies or development pressures.

I urge you to support SB 788 and to advocate for expanding these allowances statewide. Oregon's farms deserve the ability to adapt and thrive, ensuring that agriculture remains a cornerstone of our state's economy and culture for generations to come.
