My dad who is an educator today has mentioned his own financial struggles when he was in his student teaching program. The big financial strain of unpaid student teachers is a major factor in early-career educator attrition. Nearly 50% of teachers leave within their first five years due to the financial stress of unpaid teaching. Being able to pass this bill would have a big impact on Oregon's educators since it will allow them to get paid and not have to worry about finances would benefit so many individuals. Student teaching is one of the only practical collegiate experiences that do not pay the individuals who are participating in a teaching program.
