Subject: Support for Senate Bill 88

Chair Sollman, Vice-Chair Brock Smith, and Members of the Committee:

The City of Portland supports Senate Bill 88, that restricts and limits the broad range of expenses that electric and gas companies recover from rate payers today.

Energy rates have increased dramatically in recent years, and today too many Portlanders are struggling to pay their energy bills. According to Oregon Department of Energy, 27% of households in Multnomah County are energy burdened, spending more than 6% of household income on energy costs. In 2024, the impact of rising utility costs became evident, as the number of utility disconnections due to nonpayment hit record highs.

Utility costs for lawyers and lobbyists, political influence activities, advertising, and industry association fees should not be paid by families and small businesses. The "travel, lodging, entertainment or food and beverage" of utility executives should *never* contribute to power shutoffs that put Oregonians lives and livelihood at risk. These costs are a benefit for corporate interests and are not essential to provide gas or electric service for Oregonians.
