Chair Frederick, Vice-Chair Weber, and members of the committee.

My name is Christina Margaret Tobey from Portland and I am writing to urge you to support <u>Senate Bill 1098</u>, which will prohibit discrimination based on the race, religion, ability, country of origin, sexuality, or gender of the individuals featured in the content of educational and library materials in K-12 public schools in Oregon.

I am a gay woman born in 1977; I grew up with zero representation in the media and books. I know the pain and confusion of not seeing myself represented in books. I also know the pain of discrimination when people don't learn about other communities. It leads to ignorance which leads to hate. Because of my own experiences navigating a world where I was not seen or valued, I never want other children to feel this. It is vital for every child to see themselves in the books they read and learn about other communities-- books with diversity create more empathy.

This bill creates a statewide standard ensuring freedom of information both to users of that information, as well as providers of that information, for example librarians and educators.
