Every minute counts when a fire is burning out of control. Also our little community has a very large number of seniors who have needed quick response times with medical issues. We have a neighbor who has heart issues and always worry that help won't arrive in time when an emergency arises. Usually response times out here can range from 30 minutes to an hour depending on how far down the road people live. Any emergency would have a quicker response time if we were utilizing our empty fire department here in Umpqua.

This will provide Umpqua Community College Fire Science students to get real life experiences and help recruit additional new firefighters.
