RE: Oppose HB 3103 and -1 amendments

Dear Chair Helm, Chair Owens, Vice Chair McDonald, and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of the more than 55,000 members and supporters of the Sierra Club Oregon Chapter, we write in opposition to House Bill 3103-1. This bill would elevate logging above other aspects of the Oregon Department of Forestry's requirement to manage forests for the Greatest Permanent Value. Those other aspects include clean water for wildlife and human communities, salmon and wildlife habitat, and recreation.

HB 3103 would require the state forester to set timber harvest targets through rulemaking, preempting all other plans, policies, or directives made by the Board of Forestry. This would undermine the Western Oregon State Forest Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) and impede ODF's ability to implement its Climate Change and Carbon Plan (Climate Plan). HB 3103 would require a rule establishing 10-year harvest levels, thus preempting the Climate Plan, which is not adopted as a rule.

The state forester already sets ten-year harvest level goals that are required to be consistent with all other state forest values, policies and plans. ODF has a solid track record of meeting those harvest goals. HB 3103 is unnecessary and would impede the Department of Forestry and the Board of Forestry in balancing the forest values that are important to all Oregonians for ours and our children's future.
