My name is David Madsen from Salem and I am writing to urge you to support <u>Senate</u> <u>Bill 1098</u>, which will prohibit discrimination based on the race, religion, ability, country of origin, sexuality, or gender of the individuals featured in the content of educational and library materials in K-12 public schools in Oregon.
