Thank you for the opportunity to offer testimony in strong support of HB 3369. For the record, my name is Justin Low, and I am a Legislative Affairs Manager offering testimony on behalf of the Association of Oregon Counties (AOC).

AOC is a non-partisan member organization that advocates on issues that unite all county governing bodies and have an impact on county functions, governance, budgets, and services. The service relevant to my testimony today involves close collaboration with the Oregon Judicial Department, with whom Oregon counties partner with to provide security, courtrooms, and office space for the state's Circuit Court system.

Local Flexibility in Improving Courthouse Facilities

While counties shoulder much of the costs of providing offices for the state Circuit Court system, the state makes significant investments in capital construction for county courthouse spaces. Currently, the OJD budget typically contains bonds that strictly help counties with replacing courthouses. While incredibly helpful for counties that choose to or have the means to provide matching funds for a courthouse replacement, many localities face the reality that a complete replacement is simply not feasible—either due to economic constraints, logistical difficulties, political considerations, or some combination of the three. This legislation provides a crucial alternative: enabling counties to leverage bond funds to expand or remodel their existing courthouses through a method that meets community capacity, while also addressing safety and structural concerns.

Strengthening State and County Partnerships

This bill aligns with the longstanding partnership between state and county governments in Oregon. Allowing counties to obtain bond funding with the state's support for courthouse expansion and renovation demonstrates a commitment to collaborative solutions. Such partnerships not only ensure prudent spending of public dollars but also foster trust and accountability across government levels.
