The Next Door is in strong support of Senate Bill 611, Food For All Oregonians which would ensure Youth and Elderly Oregonians, regardless of immigration status, have access to the food they need to keep them and their families healthy. We support Food for All because it will help ensure we are successful at meeting our mission of opening doors to new possibilities by strengthening children and families, and improving communities. We envision a supportive community where all children and families are safe, healthy, and valued. Students will be able to focus and succeed in the classroom, parents will have piece of mind that their children will not go hungry, and will support them in being able to reduce their stress levels at work.
