These dangerous products, including menthol and candy-flavored cigarettes, are designed to attract young people and non-smokers. Flavored tobacco masks the harshness of nicotine, making it more palatable and easier to start using. As a result, the rate of tobacco use among youth is alarming – and girls are harmed the most. According to the CDC, more females than males reported current e-cigarette usage in 2023.

Evidence from public health research finds that flavored tobacco products are a significant driver of smoking among teenagers. Tobacco use remains a leading cause of preventable disease and death, and curbing access to these enticing products aligns with our commitment to public health and safety. Other states that have implemented similar bans have seen significant declines in youth smoking rates, underscoring the effectiveness of such measures. By ending the sale of flavored tobacco products, Oregon can foster a healthier environment for our youth and for future generations. I urge you to support SB 702.
