I loved playing high school sports and I enjoyed playing football and baseball alongside Paul. He was a competitor on the field and a great teammate off the field. In May 2024 Paul's gold star family was honored at a Philomath High School home baseball game.

In looking back at my high school yearbooks I found a picture of a thoughtful Paul Cochran entitled "The Thinker". He was also a class officer his senior year. We were on the student council together as I was a sophomore class officer.

Recently I was reading through some Remembrances submitted to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund and saw a reference to an idea that Paul and some platoon mates had to return home after their service and tour the country in '69 Camaro's. I was happy to read this as I drove a '67 Camaro at the time.

Paul Cochran was killed in action in Vietnam on May 1, 1968. I graduated from high school several weeks later and the Paul Jeffrey Cochran Memorial Scholarship had been quickly established. I was very honored to have been the first recipient of that scholarship.

SP4 Paul Jeffrey Cochran was buried in Willamette National Cemetery in Portland. I have visited his gravesite while I was visiting my father-in-law's burial spot in the same cemetery. Dwight Grass was a retired Navy radioman who was also an Administrator in the Philomath School District.

In conclusion, I am very happy to have known Paul Jeffrey Cochran as a classmate, teammate and also a friend.
