My name is [redacted] and I am a preschool in-home provider in Eugene Oregon.

I'm writing to urge lawmakers to invest an additional \$500 million for the Employment Related Day Care Program in SB 5514, the Department of Early Learning and Care agency budget. Investing an additional \$500 million dollars in ERDC is crucial to stabilizing the entire child care ecosystem and is essential to addressing long-standing issues plaguing our child care system. By doing so, we can ensure that all families, regardless of income level, have access to affordable and high-quality child care options that meet our unique needs. This investment will have a ripple effect throughout our economy, supporting small businesses, creating jobs, and stimulating local economic growth.

In addition to providing child care to families and supporting our child care workforce, I support this bill because as a parent myself, I know the struggle for families who rely on child care to go to work/ school, parents depend on programs like ERDC to subsidize the cost of child care which is now more than the cost of my rent.

I urge you to allocate an additional \$500 million dollars for the ERDC program in the Department of Early Learning and Care budget.
