Growing up, I watched my parents work harder than anyone I know. They spent their days in the fields, picking crops and doing backbreaking labor, all to make sure my siblings and I had food on the table. Even though they always did their best to protect us from their struggles, I could see the exhaustion in their eyes. They worked long hours, sometimes from sunup to sundown, enduring heat, cold, and unsafe conditions, just to make sure we were okay.

They sacrifice their bodies and their health to provide for us, but their work is rarely acknowledged. I see my parents struggle to make ends meet with wages that don't reflect how hard they work. Despite everything, they keep going because they believe there is no other option. Their opportunities are limited in this country. Despite it all, they know they are part of something bigger, feeding families across the country, which they are proud of. However, they deserve to be treated like human beings, not just labor machines.

This bill is critical in ensuring fair wages, access to healthcare, and the ability to speak up for better conditions without fear of retaliation. This isn't just a matter of policy, it's about fairness. It's about giving farmworkers, who do the hardest and most essential work, the recognition and support they deserve.
