Dear Esteemed Members of the House Education Committee,

I am submitting this testimony in strong support of HB 3365, which would direct the State Board of Education to integrate sustainability and climate change across all subjects for which academic content standards are established.

I graduated from Sheldon High School in Eugene in 2018, where I helped lead the Green Club, a student-led program focused on educating and engaging students on sustainability and climate issues. After high school, I studied sustainability and environmental economics at Oregon State University and worked in student outreach for the university's waste management program.
