Current disparities in utilization review policies make it harder for patients to access the treatments that best fit their needs, leaving them with fewer choices.

By creating a level playing field for nonopioid treatments, this bill empowers patients and providers to make the best decisions for individualized care, reducing reliance on opioids while ensuring effective pain relief.
