One of the most concerning aspects of this bill is how it could be exploited to create further division between parents. Instead of promoting a cooperative and supportive approach, the legislation could embolden one parent to use the parenting plan as a

tool of control, potentially disregarding the best interests of the child.

The judiciary plays a vital role in providing a balanced and nuanced perspective that takes into account the well-being of children and the specific circumstances of each family. By taking away this discretion, SB 1130 risks imposing a one-size-fits-all approach that fails to support families dealing with mental health issues, educational needs, or complex family dynamics.

I urge you to reject Senate Bill 1130 and advocate instead for policies that empower the judiciary to make thoughtful, individualized decisions. Families in crisis need flexibility, support, and resources—not rigid mandates that could cause further harm.
