Dear Chair Neron, Vice-Chairs Dobson and McIntire, and members of the Committee:

As an Oregon public charter school student, I am writing today in support of House Bill 3444. HB 3444 will fix a deep injustice currently happening in Oregon schools: that Oregon public charter school students are effectively funded at 48 cents on the dollar compared to district students. Students at Ridgeline Montessori Charter School are public school students, and it's past time to fund our education fairly.

Each student here at Ridgeline Montessori Public Charter School has a story about why this school has made a positive difference in their life. Many started out in traditional public schools, but couldn't receive the education they deserved, often due to learning challenges that required specialized attention beyond what a public school classroom could provide, or physical, developmental, or mental health challenges that public schools simply couldn't, or wouldn't, accommodate.

The reason why my charter school is special is the ability for students to have a choice in their education which is important because studies have shown that choice in peoples education has led to better concentration in students as well as self reliance. Another thing that makes Ridgeline special is a much larger community web compared to other schools.

Also, Ridgeline doesn't have a uniform, allowing students to express themselves and have freedom for individuality. Ridgeline also has programs to help support students such as learning tools, school lunches, or tutoring. Another special thing about Ridgeline is that there is much more connection and friendship between students so they can help each other adapt if they went to a traditional school. Ridgeline is also a very welcoming community, which makes the students feel safe.

Unfortunately, because of Oregon's current school funding model, public charter schools are significantly underfunded. This directly impacts me as a student. Many buildings are old and in need of upgrades, students can't access transportation services, food security programs are limited, and schools lack essential school

supplies and mental health resources. By passing HB 3444, you can fix this ongoing disparity and provide fair funding for public charter school students who deeply need it.

Please vote yes on HB 3444.
