## Subject: Testimony in Support of HB 2548 – Farmworker Standards Board Bill

My name is Debbie Cabrales, and I am the Executive Director of Centro de Servicios Para Campesinos. Our organization is dedicated to supporting farmworkers and their families by ensuring they have access to vital resources and services, including legal assistance, immigration support, health programs, and advocacy against exploitation.

Through our work, we have heard countless stories of farmworkers who pay taxes, contribute to our communities, and work tirelessly, only to be mistreated. The bill's passage will help break the cycle of exploitation and bring about the necessary changes to protect farmworkers and ensure they are treated fairly. It is the beginning of a much-needed shift toward greater justice and equity in agriculture.
