My name is Patrick Newton and I am the president of Powell's Nursery Inc. located in Gaston, Oregon, and I urge you to oppose House Bill 2548.

I have serious concerns about HB 2548 and its potential impact on all farming operations in Oregon. Small farms already face many challenges, particularly in terms of labor costs, regulatory burdens, and the need for flexibility in staffing decisions.

Here are the key issues I see:

1. **Increased Regulatory Burden**: The bill would empower unelected officials to set wages and safety rules, adding more regulations that could disproportionately affect small farms.

I call for the Legislature to reject this bill out of concern for the future of family farms in Oregon. It's important for policymakers to consider the unique challenges faced by the agricultural sector and to ensure that regulations do not inadvertently harm the very businesses they aim to protect.
