These are wastes that remain problematic for decades or longer, so these are immensely difficult and costly problems to saddle present and future Oregonians with, for a power source that could take years to become functional, and that could also present serious security risks if, for instance, an earthquake or other event damaged a reactor. Exploration of any nuclear power project is a serious undertaking and should be done wisely and carefully, not in the irresponsible manner proposed in SB215.
