Our organization, the Lake Oswego Sustainability Network (LOSN) strongly supports HB 3681, which will remove barriers and speed up the addition of new transmission lines in Oregon.

LOSN is a non-profit group, dedicated to promoting sustainable practices in our community. We hold events, send out newsletters, and offer programs for our community to educate and motivate our citizens to switch to a clean and healthy lifestyle to protect our future citizens. Thousands of Lake Oswego citizens take part in our programs, and local surveys show that climate change and sustainability are key concerns in our area.

PFAs are “forever chemicals” which build up over time. They are associated with health problems including cancer, fertility issues, high cholesterol, high blood pressure and more. They can cause cognitive and behavior problems. They can inundate our crops and interfere with our farms and forests. Now is the time to reduce our exposure to these dangerous chemicals. If we continue to wait, the problems from PFAs will continue to grow. We do this for ourselves, animal populations and for future generations.
