I am an Oregonian from Salem, Oregon who supports HB 3453. This bill will positively affect anyone traveling between the Portland metro area and Salem (and eventually, Eugene). This bill will increase regional transportation options and accessibility, and reduce congestion and greenhouse-gas emissions from intercity travel in the Willamette Valley.

This could help with giving access to necessary healthcare, bringing communities together, and providing access to recreational sites across the Willamette Valley.
