Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB215

I oppose the passage of SB215. This bill would refer a measure to the voters of Oregon to allow small modular reactors (SMRs) to be built and operated in Oregon which would bring nuclear power back into Oregon, even though Oregon voters rejected further nuclear power for Oregon in 1980.
