Dear Chair Marsh, Vice-Chair Anderson, Vice-Chair Breese-Iverson, and Members of the Committee,

Oregon is in a housing crisis, but we can start to solve it by passing HB 3746. As a member of the Medford City Council, I see firsthand how the lack of affordable homeownership options is preventing working families, young professionals, and retirees from putting down roots in our communities. If we want thriving downtowns, an affordable Oregon, and sustainable development, <u>we must pass</u> HB 3746.

This bill is about **building up, not just out**. If we fail to act, Oregon's cities will continue to expand outward, leading to more sprawl, longer commutes, increased emissions, and the loss of valuable farmland and natural spaces. HB 3746 removes barriers to condominium development, allowing us to affordably add density in walkable, transit-friendly areas where people want to live.

- It is an **environmentally responsible** housing solution. Denser, multifamily housing near jobs and transit reduces car dependency, lowers emissions, and supports vibrant, walkable neighborhoods.
- It addresses Oregon's biggest housing bottleneck. Condo construction has collapsed due to outdated liability laws. Without reform, we simply won't meet our housing production goals.

If Oregon is serious about affordable housing, smart growth, and reducing sprawl, this is the path we must take. Failing to pass HB 3746 means we are choosing an Oregon that is exclusionary, unaffordable, unsustainable, and increasingly out of reach for everyday people. We cannot let that happen.
