I OPPOSE [HB 5541]. What is the cumulative costs of all Project Labor Agreements on all State Construction Projects?

From the TEXT of [HB 5541], "...SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$19,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Transportation from American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund moneys received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and transferred to the Department of Transportation, for the Newberg-Dundee Bypass Project...."

***Governor Kotek has not done anyone any favors with the inflationary inclusion of, "Project Labor Agreements (PLAs) for the Newberg-Dundee Bypass Project."
