I am writing this letter in support of HB2029. Insurance audits can be intrusive to clients and therapists and an attempt to limit services rendered by insurance companies. There are some issues that are not even covered by insurance, such as couple's counseling. Also, when working with families which is more complex and takes greater skill, the reimbursement is oftentimes less than that for working with individuals. The added barrier of an insurance audit deters therapists from being able to provide mental health services and contributes to the already shortage of providers in the State of Oregon.
