While Bay Area First Step is NARR-accredited recovery housing, it is not the only model that is successful. The Oxford House Model is equally vital to long-term recovery and remains an indispensable asset to our communities.

Oxford House has been instrumental in my journey toward sustained sobriety and tried and true in countless others. Its emphasis on accountability, community, and independence provided me with the structure I needed to rebuild my life. Unlike other programs, Oxford House empowers residents to take ownership of their recovery while fostering a supportive environment that promotes personal growth and stability while maintaining employment.

I firmly believe that the certification process and standards of Oxford House International (OHI) should be held on equal footing with NARR certification. The unique framework of Oxford House has proven its effectiveness over decades, and imposing additional requirements could jeopardize the success of this well-established model.
