I Chad Taylor oppose HB3075 for the following reasons

- It's similarity to M114 which has been the center of legal battles draining both Oregon state tax revenue and Oregon resident's personal capitol, this will only be another degradation of those funds where the only winners will be the lawyers
- Despite the recent Appellate's opinion, it does not follow the 2nd amendment, a right delayed (permit process) is a right denied.
- Government overreach: an emergency clause at the strike of a pen in the power of a lopsided government is dangerous either way. Imagine needing a permit for the 1st or 5th amendment
- What does the government any threat, foreign or domestic plan to do to me, that they can't do to me if I have an 11+ round magazine in my gun?
- The magazine capacity ban has already not stood in court in California, and Washington's is being challenged and expected to fall as well. What's the definition of insanity again? Also, back to wasteful spending on legal fees. Don't make me write Elon!
- With the current sanctuary status, and a soon to become law sexual predator sanctuary status, how am I to feel safe? The police!? When only seconds count, they're hours away, ex. Portland OR.
- Anyone can get a gun on the black market, this HB3075 does nothing to curb that.
