Dear Oregon legislature

My name is Tony, and I am a lifelong Oregonian, 48 years old, and a law-abiding citizen with a concealed carry permit (CCW). I strongly oppose the proposed gun control bill, as the additional costs and requirements will create unnecessary barriers to responsible gun ownership. Without a clear process in place for classes or permitting, this legislation would place an undue burden on law-abiding citizens who are simply following the law.

Oregon has historically been a pro-gun state, and I never imagined I would see a day when our state would turn against half of its citizens. With a highly contested ballot measure like Measure 114, I find it deeply concerning that efforts are being made to push this through. Given the serious issues our state faces, such as homelessness and the ongoing drug crisis that affect everyone, I believe our focus should be on addressing these pressing problems rather than penalizing responsible gun owners.

This bill risks turning law-abiding citizens into criminals with the stroke of a pen, and I urge you to reconsider these efforts. There are far more urgent matters that require our attention and resources.
