My mother was a victim of a home intrusion and it still gives her nightmares. She had nothing to protect herself with on that day. They beat her and they beat her dogs as well. She is low income and can't afford most firearms, so she spend what she could on a simple Ruger LCP II in 22LR. Not a powerful handgun, but it was what she can afford. You mandating that people pay for these permits just to buy a firearm will only make it more impossible for women like her to get the protection they need.
