I also had been held back by a lot of people, family, some friends, and other relatives who didn't see my success first hand.

Shortly after I worked for the Hillsboro Hops and before that I coached basketball at YMCA in Beaverton. I proved to people who told me or anyone else around me that they won't be able to do this that we can and will.

• Portland State University is a school that I have called home for three years, and maybe more. This college is a school that all students call home and also call family.

The CCS program is a transition program that staff run to help students get a job. They also give you the strongest help to achieve your goals and dreams. It is a program for adults like me who have disabilities and I would love to have you partner with us to get this bill passed.
