Thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony. I was born and raised in Oregon, and I am a citizen of the USA. I have done a little bit of farm work, but not much. I oppose this bill, and I encourage you to kill it in Committee.

Others have said that "Oregon has a robust system of farmworker rights and protections, more stringent and comprehensive than almost any other state." I believe that to be the simple truth. Since those protections are in place, the proposed legislation is unnecessary. If only it was as simple as that.

The proposed legislation, if passed and enacted as law, would result in an unelected governing body having the authority to set increased regulations for Oregon farms. Some or all of the appointments to the governing body would be made by the Governor. We have already seen the results of regulations imposed by unelected Commissions whose membership is dominated by appointees of a governor who is beholden to radical unions and extremist groups. For example- they have played a key roll in imposing an electric vehicle (EV) mandate and so-called clean truck rules.
